

# Van Schaik Stables LLC. Barn Rules

Barn hours are Tuesday – Sunday 9am-7pm

**\*under emergency's exceptions can apply**

- **NO DRAMA/BULLYING TOLERATED**
- All riders or persons handling a horse must sign a release before riding and/or boarding any horses in any way. Boarders are responsible for having guests sign releases which can be available in the tack room.
- NO smoking allowed in or near the barn or near hay storage.
- NO dogs or pets on the property (They may remain in the car, at all times, with a window open)
- **The speed limit on the property is 5mph** for the safety of horses, riders and children.
- Children 13 and under must be supervised by an adult at all times.
- Everyone under 18 must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet when mounted on a horse.
- Long pants and riding boots with a heel must be worn for riding.
- All visitors/Family members accompanying a rider must be respectful of the property and well-behaved while at the stable.
- Clean up after your horse and yourself. There are trash containers, shovels, brooms and muck buckets available for the disposal of manure, shedded hair, hoof cleanings and general refuse in the aisle, wash stalls, and barn grounds.
- All full “messy” muck buckets must be dumped in the designated manure area and not left in the aisle.
- Horses will be turned out in designated areas only.
- If you borrow something, please return it where you found it.
- If you use something up (ex. Cookies) please replace it
- **Please turn off lights in the barn and tack room if you are the last person there.**
- **Please make sure hoses/waters are shut off if you turned them on before leaving.**
- **Please do not leave your horse unattended in any area including riding area (unless it is the designated turnout for that time)**

\*\*\*Only the owner of the horse may ride the horse. If the owner wishes to have another person ride their horse, please have the additional rider fill out a release of liability form.

If you don't do it at home... don't do it at the stable. Common sense and courtesy at all times.

**Practicing safe riding principles and good barn etiquette can mean many years of happy, healthy riding enjoyment for you and your horse. Have fun and be safe!**
